
PE Sports Premium Funding Expenditure Percentage Breakdown 2023-24

Over the course of the academic year 2023-2024, Corsham Primary school received £21,790 as part of a government funded initiative - the PE and sports premium. The graph below shows a percentage breakdown of how Corsham Primary School used the funding to improve the quality, variety and provision over the academic year 2023-24

Staff Training and Use of External Agencies

Teaching staff use schemes Real Pe and PE Hub to deliver high quality Athlete sessions twice a week. Teachers in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 also received training through external agencies including Wiltshire Cricket and Bath Rugby. Up and Under and In2Sport also worked with groups of children to support with individual targets using physical activity as the focus of their interventions.

Resources and Equipment

Corsham Primary used part of the funding to replace and improve the resource available to improve the provision of PE. There was a particular focus on the safety of children during physical activity and resources such as shin pads and new footballs were purchased to ensure safety of all children.

The employment of the Forest School Practitioner enabled all areas of the curriculum to be accessed by all children across all schools throughout the year. These sessions promote OAA opportunities and being physically active and safe in the outdoors.

Increasing Participation, Variety and the amount of Competitive Sports

The employment of the SSCO allowed the children to attend sporting events that were competitive and non-competitive. These were mainly focusing on year 5 and 6 and many children represented the school in a range of sports but were also offered to Year 3 and 4s in the summer term

Sports days went ahead at both sites and events where every child had the opportunity to participate.

Bath Rugby Foundation, In2Sport, Up and Under and Wiltshire Cricket all provided opportunities for all children in year groups to participate in competitive and participation activities in school.

We also provided the opportunity for those children that could not swim 25 metres in year 5 and 6 with booster sessions. Year 3 and 4 children also swam for two terms.

Monitoring Impact & Stationary and Materials

Whilst the lead athletes were not able to complete lesson observations this year, we were able to complete pupil conferencing to gather pupil's thoughts about being an athlete at Corsham Primary School. Monitoring lessons will become a priority focus for lead athletes next year.
